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A REPORT ON BURSERY FOR THIRTY SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS.

INTRODUCTION

Tsogolo la Ana organization is a registered local non governmental organization which was established in 2005. Its mission is to work with orphans and vulnerable children towards promoting their rights and improving the livelihood of their families. One of its programs is education.

In 2009 to 2010 academic year, first term we received funding about MK 320,995 from Open Hearts Germany to support 30 needy children from Muhasuwa C.D.S.S and Namadidi C.D.S.S.

First term (Dec. 2009 to Feb. 2010)

• The schools opened for first term on 7 December, 2009 and will close on 19 February 2010.

Junior Certificate Examination Results Muhasuwa C.D.S.S

• 5 (3 girls, 2 boys) sat for J.C.E and 4 (2 girls, 2 boys) passed the examinations while one girl failed.

Namadidi C.D.S.S

- 5 (2 girls, 3 boys) sat for JCE and 3 boys passed the examination and 2 girls failed.
- In total 5 boys and 2 girls passed the Examination and 3 girls failed representing 70% pass and 30 % fail.

- The girls who failed J.C.E Exams are Gloria Naura (muhasuwa), Edina Maoni and Maria Maloya (Namadidi).
- The students who failed the exams were replaced by other needy students in the same class.
- The replacements were as follows:
- 1. Gloria Naura (girl) from Muhasuwa C.D.S.S was replaced by Asafa Phiri (male) who passed J.C E exams and he is in form 3.
- 2. Edina Maoni from Namadidi C.D.S.S was replaced by Stella Nambazo who passed J.C.E exams and he is in form 3.
- 3. Maria Maloya from Namadidi C.D.S.S was replaced by Maria Msiro who passed J.C.E exams and she is in form 3.
- The grades for Maria Msiro are among the list above.

End of form 1 Results (2009)

- 10 students (4 boys, 6 girls) who were in form 1 in 2009 academic year are in form 2 since all form ones go to form two whether they pass or fail.
- Only 3 boys passed end of term examinations in form 1 representing 30%.
- 2 boys who managed to score well in other subjects failed because they failed English.

Group counseling

 Individual and group Counseling to have been provided to the students in relation to their performance ad behaviour. Ndaziona Matola was one of the students who received individual counseling after hearing that she is too playful. Gladys Kaduya was also counseled after hearing that she is rude to the teachers. Ester Munta was counseling after hearing from her sister that she is rude at home.

Identification of 10 new needy students for 2009 to 2010 academic year

- For the past 2 academic years identification of children was done in collaboration with teachers, school committee ad NAMASO but students were not given a test as a result number of failures was high. So board and management decided to introduce amplitude test to the identified form 1 needy students in order to reduce the number of failures in class.
- 15 (6 girls, 9 boys) needy students were identified and all were given an amplitude test (English and Mathematics).

• 11 students scored above 50 % but we selected the best 10 students. We gave them a test to reduce the number of failures on our bursary list. The identified students and their scores are as follows:

Schools fees for 1st term (Dec 2009 to Feb.2010) to have been paid for 30 students. Enclosed are the school fees receipts.

- All children to have received 10 notebooks each, 2 ball point pens.
- 10 form 2 students received school uniform.

LIBRARY

- A moving library to have been established.
- Identification of text books was done in collaboration with the subject teachers in schools in order for us to buy the recommended books (books which are in the syllabus)
- 85 text books of various subjects to have been bought and lent to students.
- We are working hand in hand with the teachers of these schools to help us monitor the books since they are the ones who are close to them.

IMPACT

 The text books will increase the reading culture of the children as a result their knowledge will be boosted. If their knowledge is boosted they will perform well in class.
